Article (1): General Rules

1. The Supreme Organizing Committee for the Asian Road and Para-Cycling Championships – Al-Qassim 2026

A Supreme Committee shall be formed to oversee the organization of the Asian Road and Para-Cycling Championships – Al-Qassim 2026. This committee serves as the highest authority responsible for planning, managing, implementing, and monitoring all organizational, technical, and administrative aspects related to the championship, in coordination with the Asian Cycling Confederation and the relevant entities.

2. The 2026 Asian Road Cycling Championships are organized by the Asian Cycling Confederation (ACC), with the approval of the Saudi Cycling Federation, and under the patronage of His Royal Highness Prince Dr. Faisal bin Saud bin Abdulaziz Al Saud, Governor of the Al-Qassim Region.

3. The championship shall be organized in accordance with the regulations of the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI), and these regulations shall apply to all matters not explicitly stated in this guide.

4. The 2026 Asian Road Cycling Championships, which include time trial races and road races, will be held from 5 to 13 February 2026. Riders registered by their national federations will compete as national teams.

Article (2): Legal and Regulatory Reference

Without prejudice to the provisions of the Asian Cycling Confederation Statutes, the regulations of the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI), and the technical and organizational regulations of the championship, the provisions of this regulation shall apply to the championship.

Article (3): Participants

1. Riders (male and female) must hold the nationality of the participating country from within the Asian continent.

2. Riders shall be subject to the provisions stipulated in the Continental Championships Regulations.

Article (4): The Supervisory Committee

1. The Supervisory and Monitoring Committee of the Saudi Cycling Federation is responsible for the overall supervision of the championship, in direct coordination with the organizing committees of the Asian Cycling Confederation. This ensures full compliance with the approved continental technical and organizational standards. Supporting committees from both the continental and international federations shall be formed to ensure role integration and achieve the highest levels of organization.

2. The Supervisory and Monitoring Committee shall review all matters related to the championship, including complaints and disputes referred by the competent committees. It shall approve violations and impose sanctions based on the proposals and recommendations submitted by those committees. The committee shall also endorse the final results and decisions and submit them to the continental federation to ensure the integrity of procedures and compliance with the approved organizational and technical standards.

Article (5): Registration and Participation

1. Each participating country must provide the Organizing Committee with the complete delegation forms and all required documents as follows:

a. Numerical Participants Registration Form, to be submitted no later than 31 December 2025.

b. The names list form, including passport numbers and personal photos for all delegation members and riders, for the purpose of issuing visas and entry permits, to be submitted no later than 20 December 2025.

c. The Organizing Committee must be provided with recent personal photographs of all delegation members and riders for the issuance of accreditation badges.

Article (6): Responsibilities of Participants

1. The participating delegation in the Asian Road Championships – Al-Qassim 2026 shall bear full responsibility for the health and fitness of its riders. It shall be solely liable for any obligations related to pre-existing medical conditions or injuries. The Organizing Committee shall not assume any costs or consequences in this regard.

b. The Organizing Committee strongly recommends that all participating national teams provide comprehensive health insurance for all delegation members and riders, ensuring coverage of medical and treatment procedures in the event of any accidents, injuries, or medical conditions during the championship period.

Article (7): Health-Related Obligations of the Organizing Committee

1. The Organizing Committee of the Asian Road Championships – Al-Qassim 2026 shall provide first aid services at all competition venues, in addition to arranging the transport and emergency care of individuals whose condition requires referral to the nearest hospital or medical facility for initial treatment. Any further medical procedures or additional costs beyond initial care shall be borne by the participating country or its respective delegation.

Article (8): Publishing and Media Usage Rights

1. The Organizing Committee of the Asian Road Championships – Al-Qassim 2026, in cooperation with the Asian Cycling Confederation, retains all publishing rights and the right to use images and media materials related to participants and competitions for promotional and advertising purposes as deemed appropriate. No entity or individual shall be entitled to claim any permissions or financial returns resulting from such use.

Article (9): Transportation Services and Delegation Accommodation

1. The Organizing Committee shall provide transportation services for participants who meet the registration and participation requirements, exclusively between the accredited championship hotels and the official competition venues. Delegations and riders who are not accommodated in the accredited hotels shall not be permitted to participate, with the exception of the delegation of the host country.

Article (10): Accommodation, Transportation, Arrival and Departure

a. Arrival and Departure

1. The Organizing Committee shall receive all participating teams upon their arrival at Riyadh International Airport and Al-Qassim International Airport, in accordance with the approved arrival schedules that have been communicated in advance to the committee.
2. The Organizing Committee shall arrange transportation for teams to Riyadh International Airport and Al-Qassim International Airport upon departure, in accordance with the approved and communicated schedules submitted to the committee.

b. Transportation

- The Organizing Committee shall provide buses to transport the teams between the accredited hotels and the competition venues throughout the championship period, following a scheduled shuttle transportation system. Daily transportation services shall be allocated as follows:

- 1 VIPs, technicians, commissaires, and delegation management: scheduled private cars or vans.
- 2 Riders and accompanying staff: scheduled buses.
- 3 Media personnel and other categories: scheduled buses.

c. Accommodation

1. Two categories of accredited hotels, three-star and four-star, have been designated to accommodate the varying financial capabilities and preferences of the participating delegations. (Categories and fees are attached in the financial regulations.)
 2. Should any participating delegation wish to reside in a five-star hotel, arrangements may be made through the Organizing Committee, which will secure the hotel and coordinate the reservation based on prior booking and availability, no later than 31 December.
 3. The designated hotels for the Para-cycling participants have been selected to ensure suitability for individuals with physical and visual disabilities.
 4. All accredited hotels are located within the Al-Qassim region and are situated at a travel time of approximately 30 to 50 minutes from the competition venues in peak cases, depending on traffic conditions.

Article (11): Medical Affairs and Anti-Doping

1. The Medical Services Committee, accredited by the Championship Supreme Committee, shall supervise all medical matters related to the championship.
2. Medical units and first-aid stations shall be established at all competition venues to provide primary healthcare when needed.
3. Anti-doping testing procedures shall be implemented in all competitions by the Saudi Anti-Doping Committee, in accordance with the international laws and regulations issued by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA).

Article (12): Entry Visas and Security Clearances

1. All delegation members who are required to obtain entry visas or prior security clearances for the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia must submit the designated form, accompanied by a copy of their passports, to the Organizing Committee no later than 20 December 2025. The passport validity must be no less than six months from the date of entry.

Article (13): Arrival and Departure Schedules

The Organizing Committee must be notified of the delegation's arrival date and airport in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, along with the airline name, flight number, departure airport, sports equipment, and accompanying luggage, no later than 20 January 2026, in accordance with the following form:

Article (14): Interpretation and Amendment of the Regulation Provisions

1. The right to interpret the provisions of this regulation shall rest with the Supervisory and Monitoring Committee of the championship.
2. The Supervisory and Monitoring Committee shall have the authority to make amendments and take any necessary measures regarding matters for which no explicit provision is stated in this regulation.
3. Amendments shall be approved after being submitted to the competent authority within the Asian Cycling Confederation.
4. The Statutes and all regulations of the Asian and International Cycling Federations shall serve as the final reference in the event of any conflict with the provisions of this regulation.

Article (15): Official Correspondence

All official correspondence related to participation in the 2026 Asian Road and Para-Cycling Championships – Al-Qassim, including requests and inquiries concerning organizational or technical matters of the championship, shall be addressed to the Organizing Committee or the Supervisory and Monitoring Committee, using the contact details provided below.

Financial Regulations

Article (1): Financial Fees

a. Organizing Committee:

The Organizing Committee in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia shall not charge any financial fees to the participating delegations for hosting the 2026 Asian Road and Para-Cycling Championships – Al-Qassim, nor for organizing its various events, except for hotel accommodation fees.

b. Arrival and Transportation:

The Organizing Committee of the Saudi Cycling Federation shall cover the expenses of airport reception and departure services, including transportation by buses and vehicles between Riyadh International Airport and Al-Qassim International Airport and the designated hotels. It shall also cover daily transportation between the hotels and the competition venues.

c. Entry Visa Fees:

The Supreme Committee of the Saudi Cycling Federation shall cover all procedures related to issuing entry visas to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia for delegations that have fulfilled the registration requirements and submitted all necessary documentation no later than 20 December 2025. Registration will close on 31 December 2025. Delegations registering after 20 December 2025 will be responsible for the visa procedures.

Article (2): Accommodation and Meal Fees

1. Three-star and four-star hotels accredited by the Organizing Committee have been selected, taking into consideration their proximity to essential services and the competition venue.
2. Reservation and Accommodation Policy
 - a. All hotel reservations for the participating delegations shall be made through the Organizing Committee of the championship.
 - b. Participating national teams shall specify their accommodation preferences, including the number and types of rooms, in accordance with the designated accommodation reservation forms.
 - c. The forms shall be submitted to the Organizing Committee no later than 08 January 2026.
 - d. Rooms shall be allocated by the Organizing Committee based on booking priority and the availability of rooms in the selected hotel.
 - e. The number of available rooms in four-star hotel facilities is limited according to the approved capacity and booking priority.
 - f. The official hotel check-in time is 12:00 p.m., and the check-out time is 2:00 p.m.
 - g. Should national teams wish to add extra days, the additional nights shall be charged at the same rates listed below, following coordination with the Organizing Committee.
 - h. National teams wishing to book a five-star hotel must contact the Organizing Committee before 31 December 2025.

- Accommodation Fees

1. The fees include accommodation and buffet dining, starting from dinner on the day of arrival and ending with breakfast on the day of departure.
2. Option One: Four-Star Hotels
 - a. USD 175 per person per night in a single room.
 - b. USD 150 per person per night in a double room.

3. Option Two: Three-Star Hotels

- a. USD 110 per person per night in a single room.
- b. USD 90 per person per night in a double room.
- c. USD 90 per person per night in a triple room.

4. Services and Logistical Support

1. Varied meals (buffet breakfast, lunch, and dinner).
 2. Representatives from the Organizing Committee will be present in each hotel to facilitate procedures and provide additional services.

Article (3): Payment of Accommodation and Meal Fees

1. A non-refundable payment of 25% of the accommodation fees, based on the selected hotel category, must be made to the account indicated in the accommodation form, according to the number and type of rooms (single, double, triple). Proof of payment must be submitted to the Organizing Committee no later than 08 January 2026.

2. The accommodation reservation for the participating delegation will not be confirmed until the accommodation fees have been paid to the Organizing Committee.

Article 3: Race Office (Permanence)

The race office will be located at the Saudi Cycling Federation Address , the office hour will be 09:00-17:00. The race office will also be located at the official hotel of the Championships) from 1th February 2026 till the championships finish. The organizer may establish the temporary race office at the start and/or finish line on each race day.

Article 4: License Control / Numbers and Transponders Distribution

The license control will be held on 4th February2026 (the specific room and time will be announced later (specific room will be announce later) 10:00.

Article 5: Team Manager Meeting

The Team Manager Meeting will be held on 4th February 2026 (the specific room and time will be announced later)14:00

Article 6: Starting Order for ITT and Mixed Team Time Trial

1. The starting order and the start interval for time trial events will be considered by the Commissaire Panel and communicate to teams after the Team Manager Meeting.
2. For Road Races, before each race: all riders concern must be present on the sign on podium for signing on. The sign on will be open 60 minutes before the start time and will be closed 15 minutes before the start time. The rider(s) who fail to sign on will be penalized by the UCI regulations.

Article 7: Bicycles and Equipment Control

1. For all Time Trial events, all bicycles will be checked by the UCI Commissaire prior to start. The checked bicycle could not be taken out of the bicycle control area otherwise the bicycle concern must be rechecked before start.
2. For Time Trial events, the change of bicycle can be done only by team car. The spare bicycles also have to be checked by the Commissaire prior to the start.
3. For Road Race events, the change of bicycle can be done by team car, Neutral Service cars and in the pit (Only in the circuit).

Article 8 Radio Tour

1. Radio Tour frequency: will be announced at the Team Manager Meeting.
 2. Race information will be broadcast throughout each race via the radio system.
 3. The distribution of radio to team managers will take place during the license control. All team managers must sign the receiving and returning of the transmitters. And the transmitters must be returned to the organizer immediately after the last race of each team.
-

Article 9: Team Cars

1. Team cars are allowed to join the race convoy in all competitions. The team cars will be distributed to the teams concerned at the start line of each race and must be returned to the organizer immediately after the Championships.
2. Teams are not allowed to use any cars in the race other than those provided by the organizer.
3. Team Managers are responsible for any damage caused to the team car during their possession, including traffic violations.
4. The order of team cars in the race convoy will be determined by the Commissaire Panel in coordination with the organizer. The principle of team car order depends on the number of riders per team at the start of each race, or as agreed upon in the Team Managers' Meeting.

Article 10: Neutral Service Support

1. The Neutral Service will be provided by 3 cars in each race.
2. The spare wheels are equipped with 12 Shimano speed sprockets. And combine both disc break and rim break system.
3. The spare bicycles provide strip pedals, the sizes will be 48, 50, 52 and 54

Article 11: Feeding

1. No feeding allowed during time trial events .
2. Feeding Zone in the circuit races will be located near near Start - Finish line.
3. Feeding from team cars start at 30 km from start and finish at last 10 km.

Article 12: Time of Arrival

1. There is no time limit for time trial race. Time limit for road race is 10%.
 2. The time can be increased in case of exceptional circumstances by the commissaire's panel, in agreement with the organizer.

Article 13: Award Ceremonies

1. In accordance with article 1.1.112 of the UCI regulations, the best 3 riders (Mixed team time trial) of each category must attend the official awards ceremony.
2. For the individual time trial a zone for the best 3 times will be prepared near the finish line.
3. Every competition of the Asian Road cycling Championships will be awarded with:

The 1st place:	Champions jersey / Gold medal and certificate
The 2nd place:	Silver medal and certificate
The 3rd place:	Bronze medal and certificate

Article 14: Doping Control

Doping controls will be conducted in accordance with the regulations of the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI). The doping control station will be located near the finish line and will be carried out by the internationally accredited authorities in cooperation with the Saudi Anti-Doping Committee.

Article 15: Penalties

Penalties will be applied in accordance with the UCI regulations.

Article 16: Responsibilities

1. The organizers and ACC will not, under any circumstances, be liable to any accidents or damage that occur during training and competitions.
 2. The organizers and ACC decline all responsibilities towards the riders and others in case of an accident. For all cases not covered by these specific regulations, the UCI rules will apply.

Article 17: Environment Protection

All parties concerned are prohibited from throwing waste outside the designated areas (Waste Zone) set by the organizer. In case of violation of this article, offenders may be subject to legal prosecution in addition to the penalties stipulated in the UCI Regulations

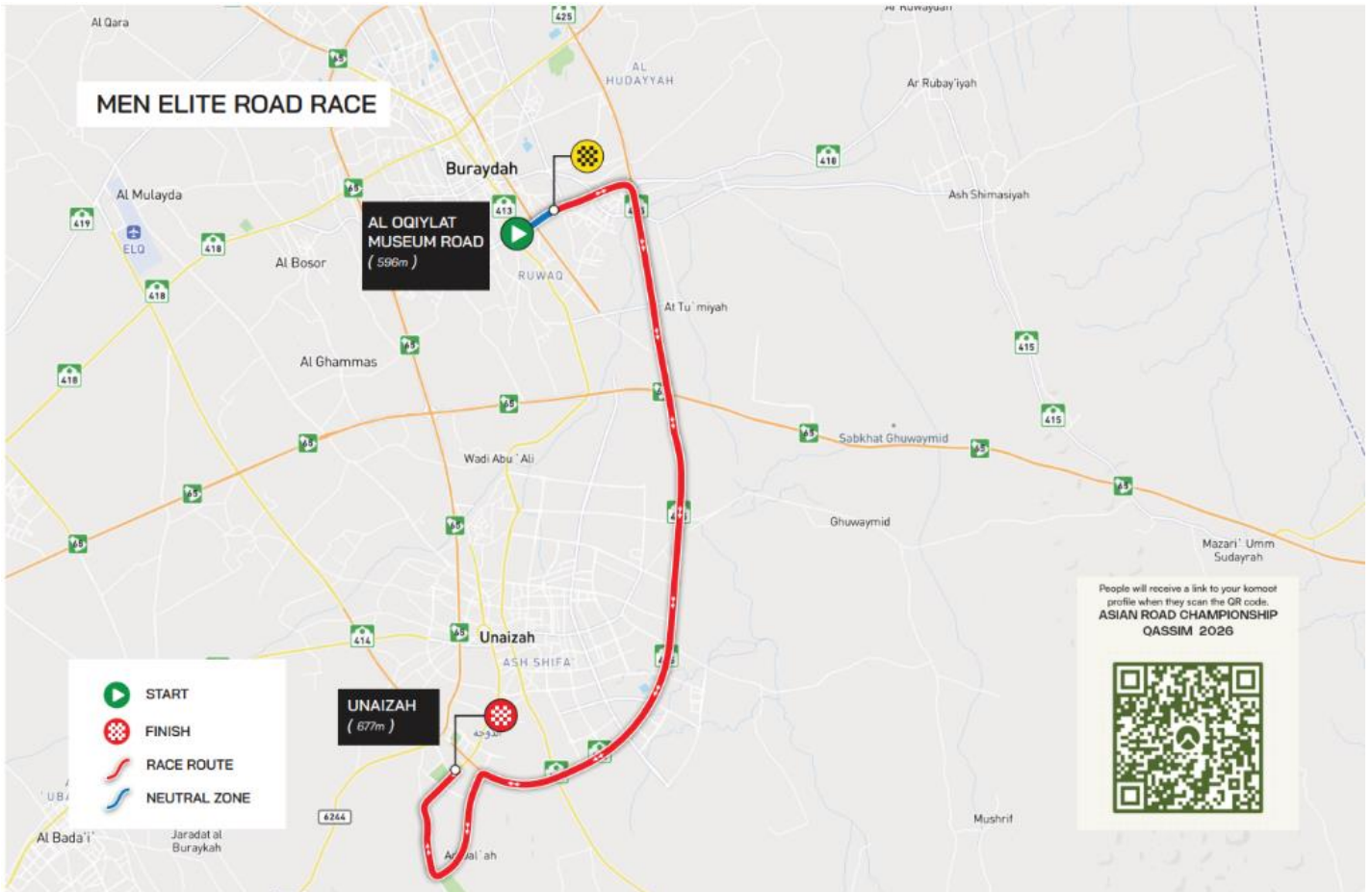

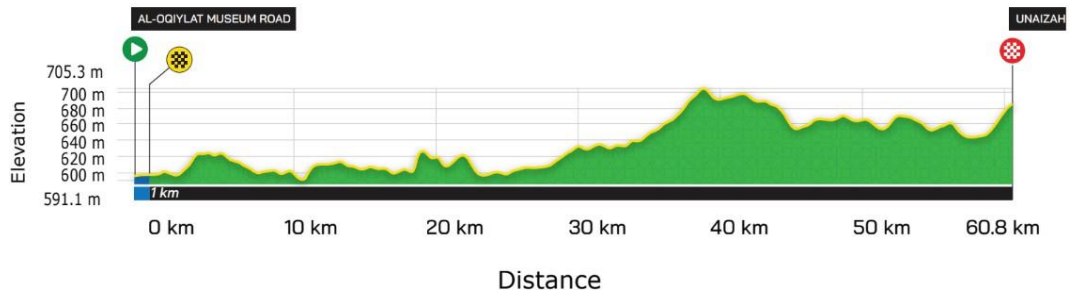

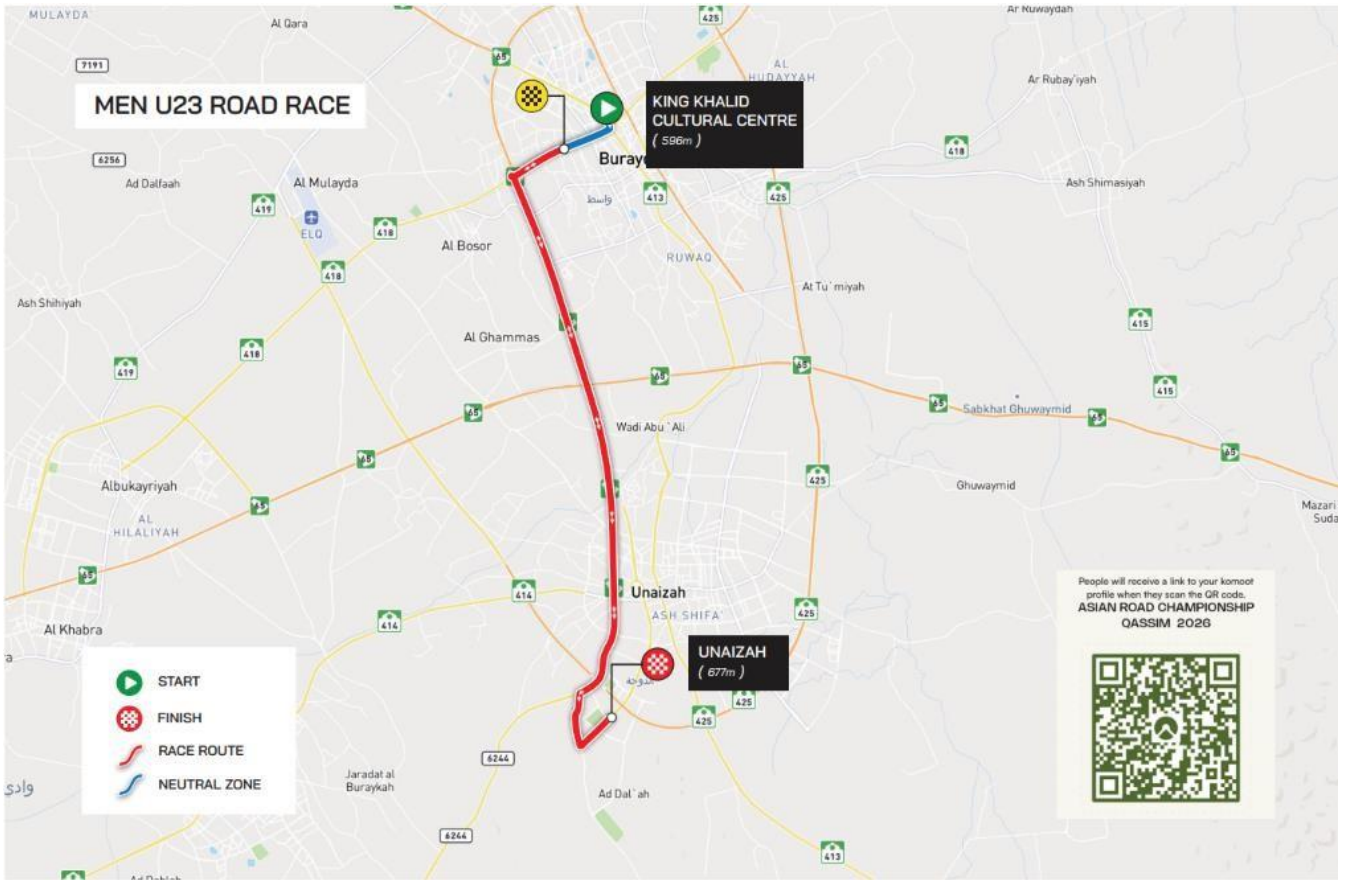


COURSE PROFILE : MEN ELITE ROAD RACE

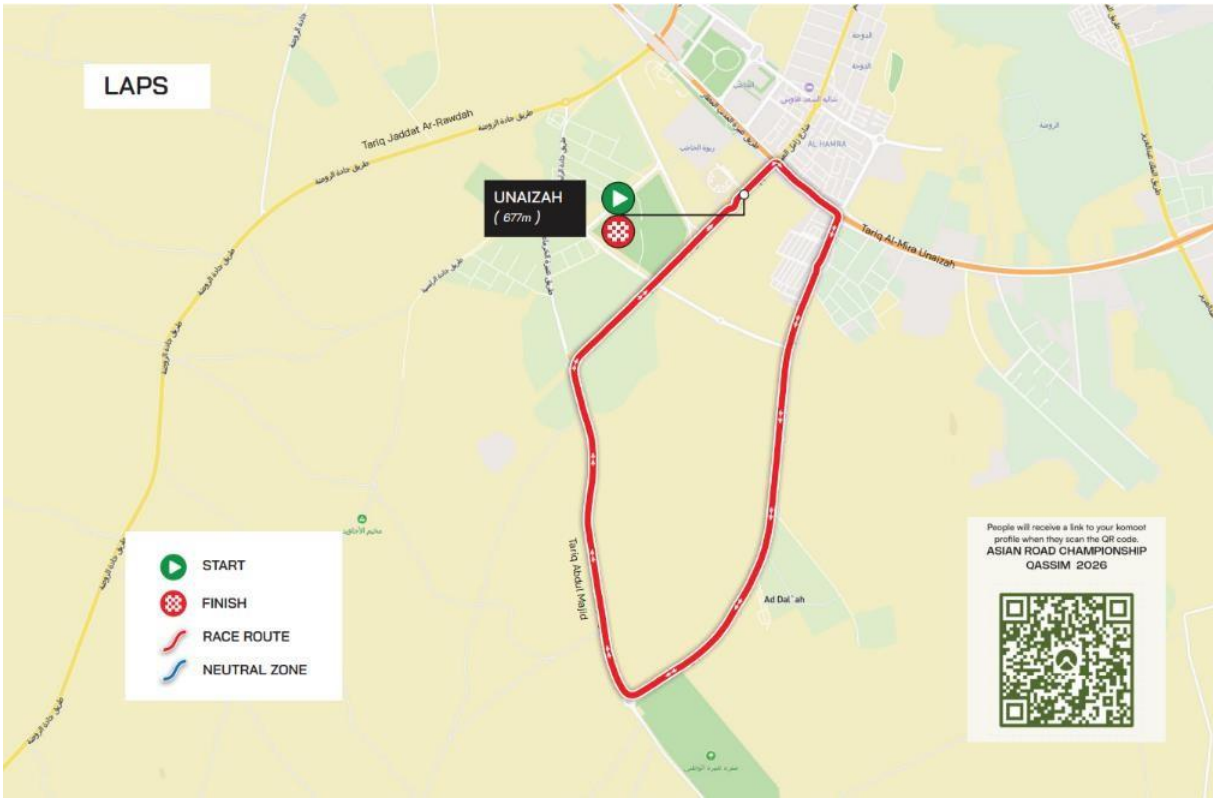




COURSE PROFILE : MEN U23 ROAD RACE *Elevation Gain : 388 m*

COURSE PROFILE : LOOP MEN ELITE & MEN U23 Elevation Gain : 180 m



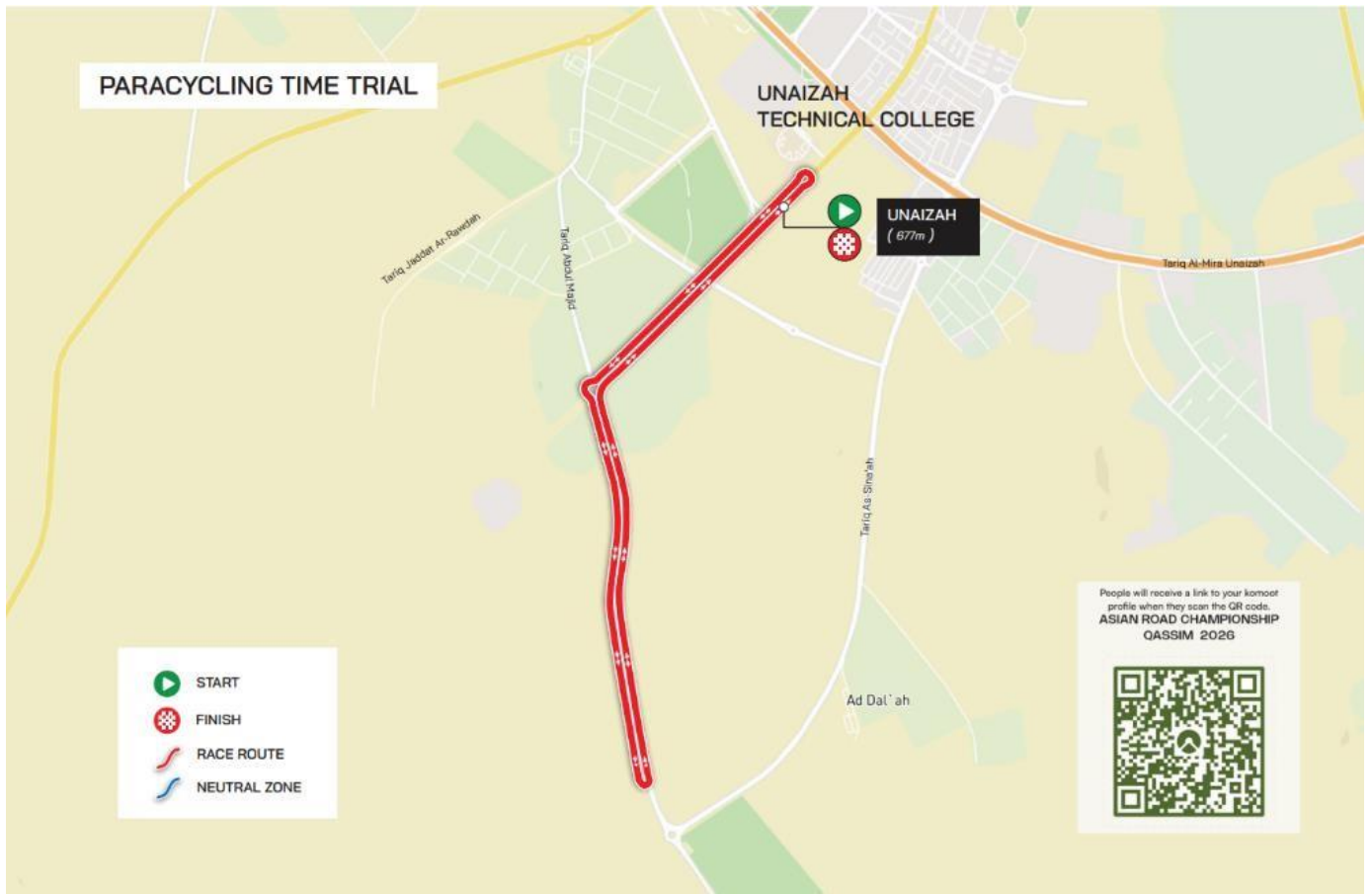

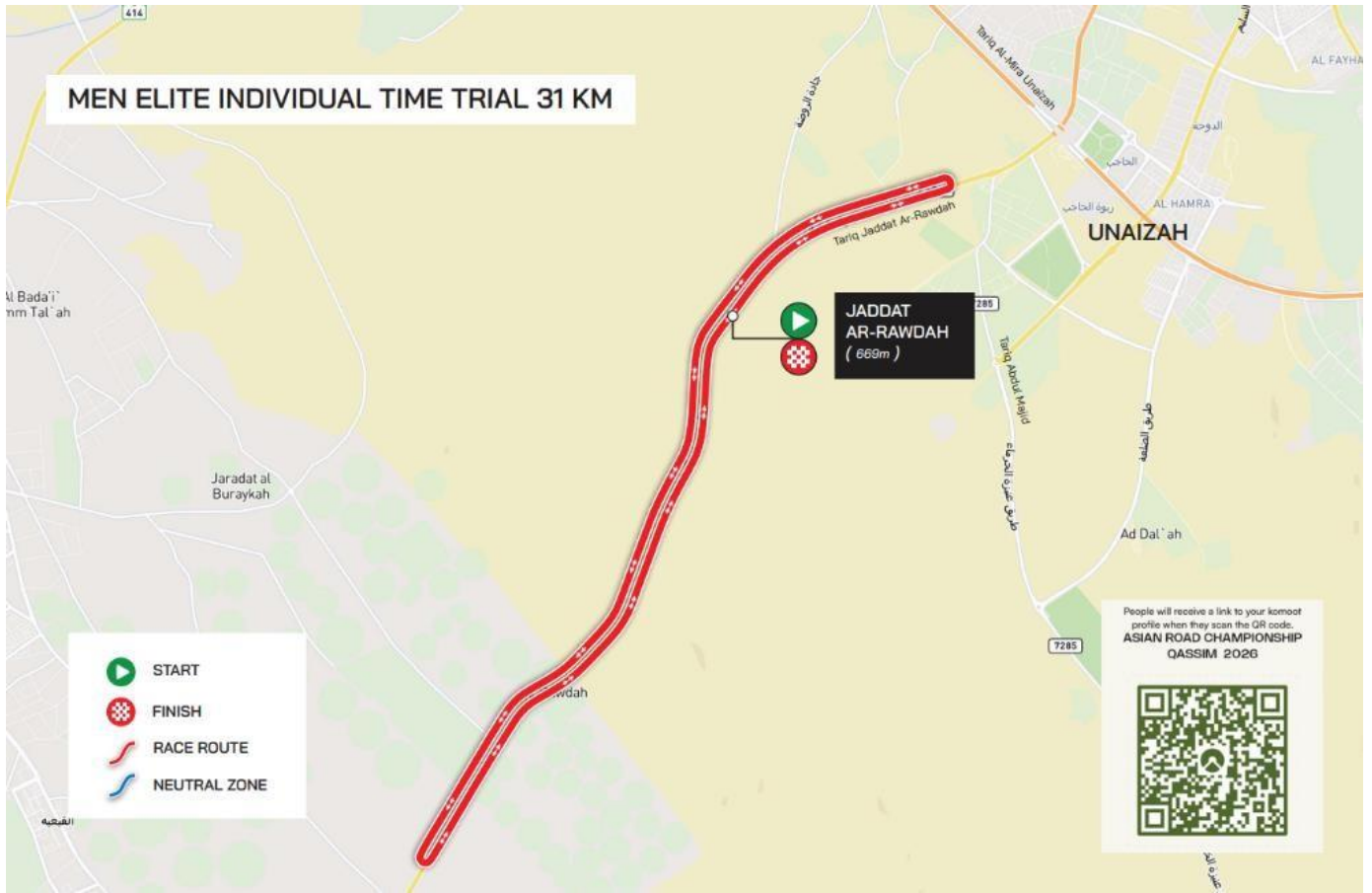
COURSE PROFILE : PARACYCLING ROAD RACE *Elevation Gain : 78 m*





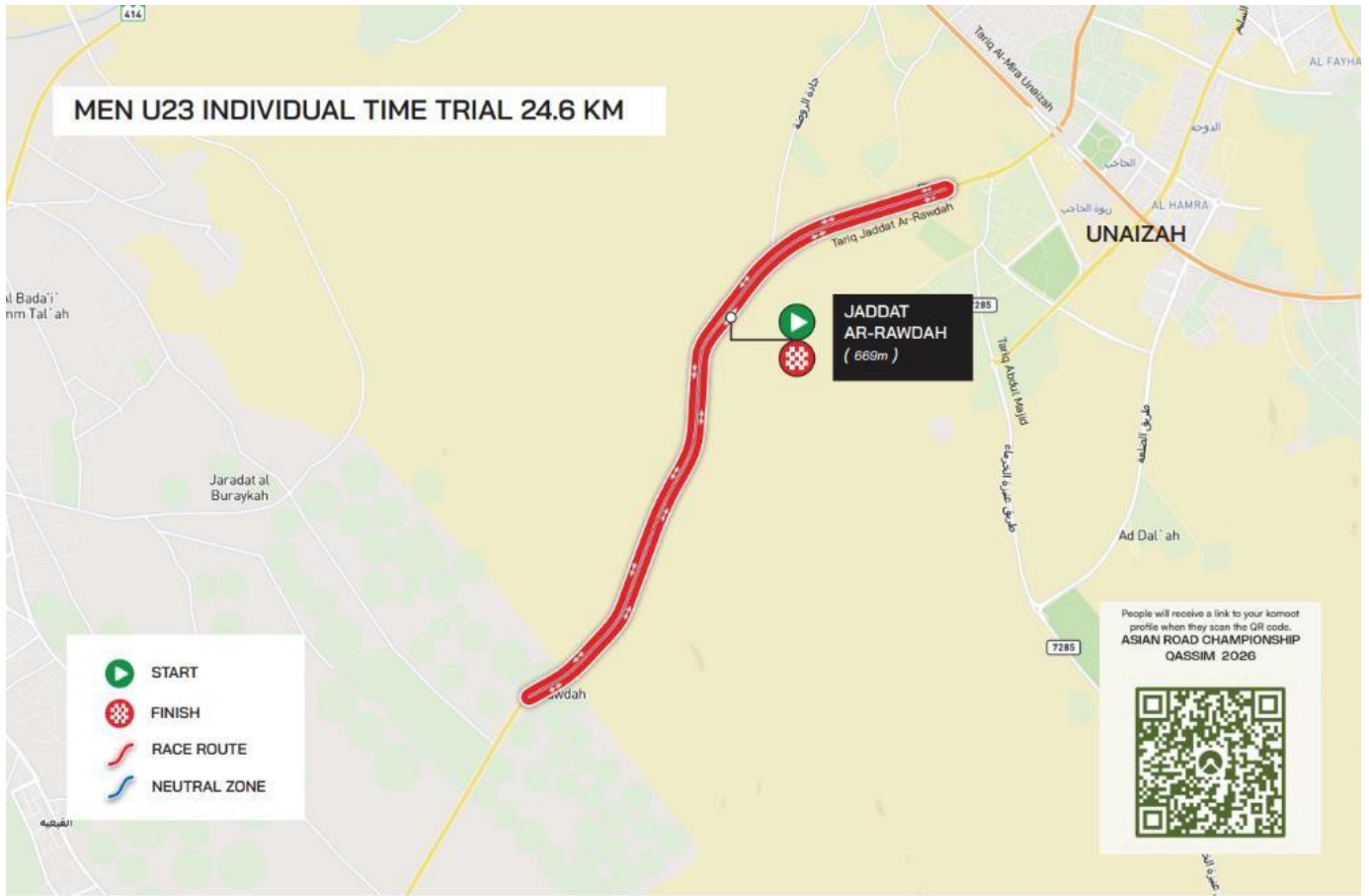
COURSE PROFILE : PARACYCLING TIME TRIAL Elevation Gain : 111 m





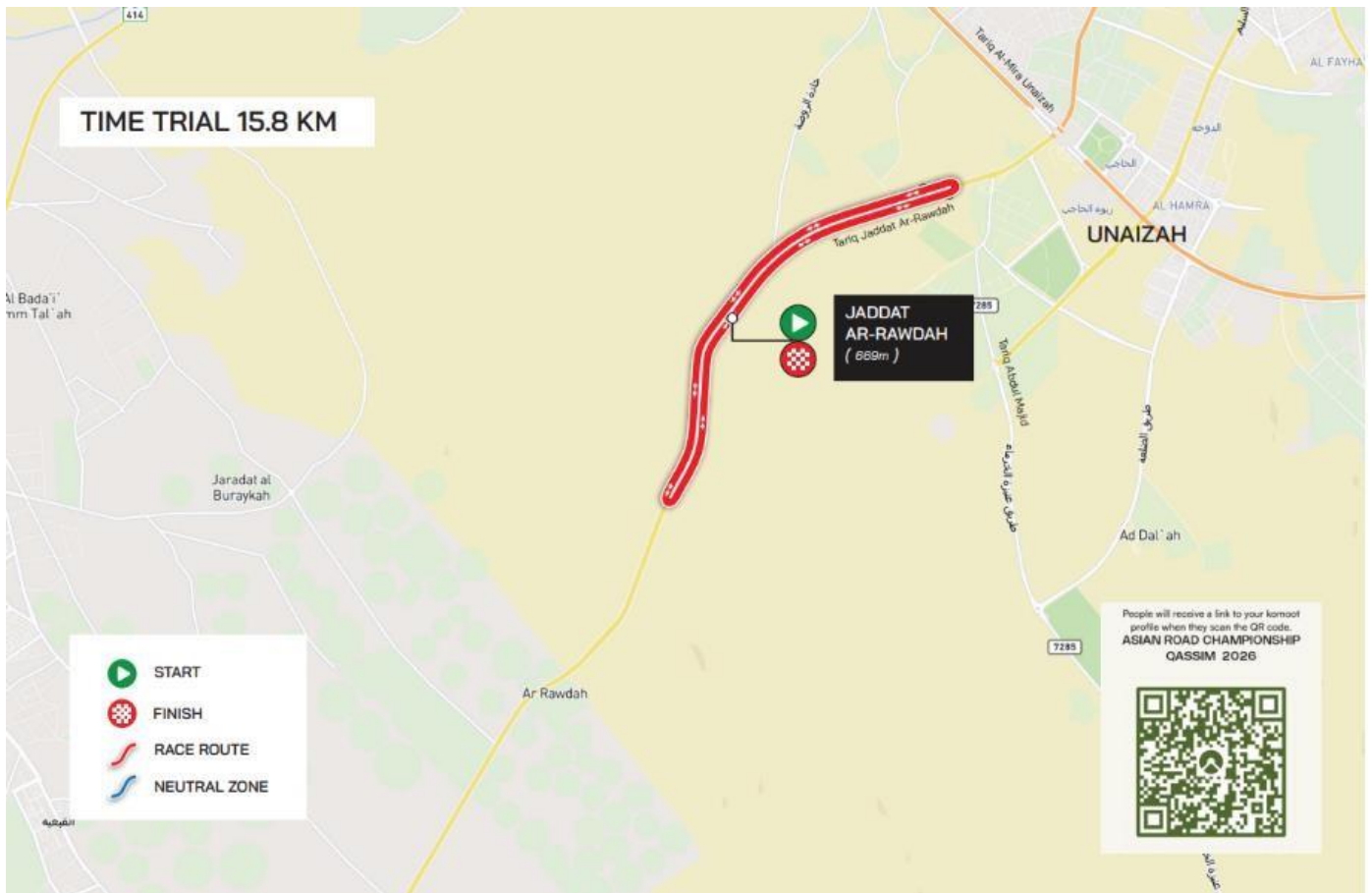
COURSE PROFILE : MEN ELITE INDIVIDUAL TIME TRIAL *Elevation Gain : 62 m*

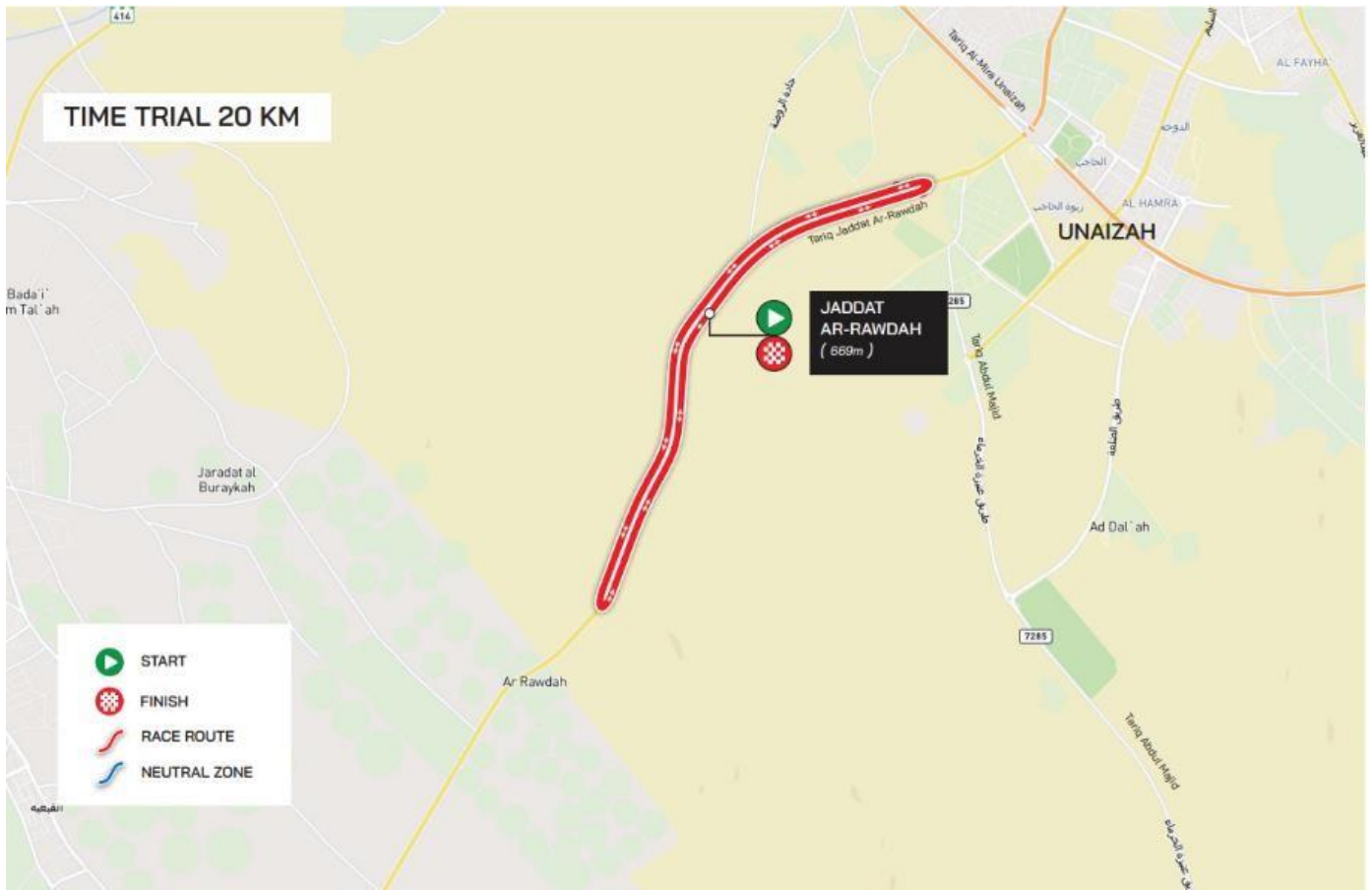




COURSE PROFILE : TIME TRIAL 15.8 KM *Elevation Gain : 174 m*
